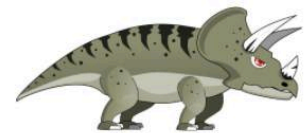
My favourite moment was the feeling I got at the end of my race, I felt the feeling of accomplishment and I didn't care if I had come first or not!
