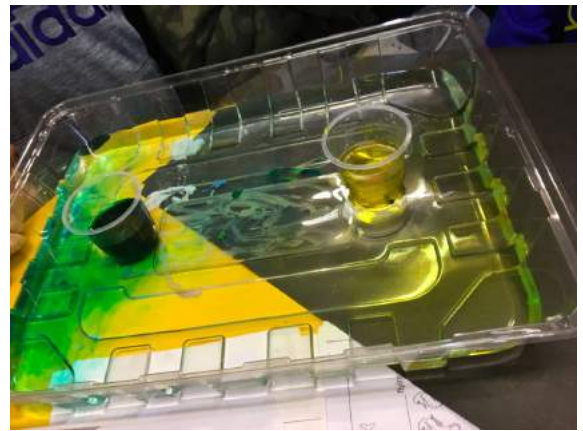
INQUIRY- MOON- What Are Tides?

Experiment on how tides work as the moon rotates around the earth and the sun- lunar eclipse the earth is the blue circle in the middle surrounded by the ocean. As the moon located on the side of the earth, it pulls the ocean and it causes low tide.



This is the moon and the sun pulling the ocean at each side of the earth.

Another experiment- children observed how the current pressure moves and changes the sea level as it travels through the cold and warm air.



The yellow colour represents the warm air and the green represents the cold air

The cost for our camp per child is \$230.
