Week 2 Term 2 | 9 May 2018

Tena koutou e te whanau, he mihi nui kia koutou katoa Kia ora, Talofa lava and Bonjour. Welcome to Week 2 of Term 2.

It was great to welcome all our new whānau, staff and returning children at our Whakatau on the first day of term where you see our School at its best as we are "growing together as one". It is always an exciting time for all, with recharged batteries looking forward to the new learning and challenges of the coming term. We also see the final stages of the renovation work on the 1884 building nearly complete. We intend to move in on Monday 28th May and prior to that, there will be an opening ceremony [please keep an eye out for a date and time. This will come out once confirmed with Ngāti Whātua]. We are thinking it may be next week on Friday.

Another task we are currently working on is what will replace National Standards and Ngā Whanaketanga Rumaki Māori as a way of **reporting to parents** and caregivers now that the Government has removed them from legislation and mandated reporting processes. This work is being led by Emma [Deputy Principal] and a team of teachers/kaiako. The team are keen to hear from parents/caregivers about your thoughts on what you would like to know about your child/ren when we report and this can be done by emailing Emma at emma@richmondroad.school.nz Please get any feedback to the team by Friday 1st June 2018.

As you will know, I and another Principal are presenting a workshop at the International Conference on Thinking [cultivating mindsets for global citizens]. You can find the blurb about our talk here:

http://digitalcommons.fiu.edu/icot18/ICOT18/complete calendar/15/ I am speaking about how the work we have been doing since 2015 around formative assessment practices has made a difference to teacher effectiveness and a child's ability to have agency over their own learning. While I am away [Monday 14th to Tuesday 22nd May] David will be Acting Principal for day to day contact but I am still available via email.

David over the April break attended the Reggio Emilia international study tour where he was able to see in action and reflect on the image of the child and the teacher, the notion of the environment as third teacher, the notion of pedagogy of listening, making learning visible through documentation, the role of the pedagogista and your role as a professional leader. David will write about this experience in an upcoming newsletter.

On some administration, we'd ask that the doors into the new linkway on Douglas Street not be used for entering or exiting the building. These doors are for emergency exit only but currently, the final fencing is not yet complete and we know it is tempting for these doors to be used. Once all the fencing is complete they will not be accessible for general use.

The swimming pool is now up and running and your child's teacher will advise you of the timetable/s. We do need helpers, so please see the relevant teachers for offers of help. We can't do this without your help. Thank you in advance.




For all your PTA stories/items we now have a PTA Page!

BELL TIMES

Children can arrive from 8.30am onwards and school is from 9.00am to 3.00pm. Please make sure you have arranged collection of your child by 3.00pm.

Breaks: Morning tea is at 11.00-11.30am and lunch time is at 1.00-1.50pm.

LATENESS, ABSENCE AND APPOINTMENTS

If your child happens to be **late**, please sign in (or remind him/her to sign in) at the office first and then your child will be given a late pass for the teacher's attention. Otherwise you will get an absence notification.

If you **take your children out** before the end of the day, please come to the office first where you can sign your child out and be given a sign out pass for the teacher's attention.

If your child is **absent**, please let the office know **with** a **valid justification** either by email at <u>absences@richmondroad.school.nz</u>, by phone or through the absence form on our website, even if you have told the teacher already. Otherwise you will get an absence notification.

For all absence without justification, we will send you an **absence notification** through text or email. Please make sure you provide us with your latest contact information and let us know if you have a preferred contact to use.

ACTIVITY FEE AND CONSENT FORM FOR TRIPS

We encourage you to pay the Activity Fee of \$80.00 (per child per year) to ensure your child can participate easily in all EOTC (Education Outside The Classroom) activities without having to pay separately for a trip (this covers 3 - 4 trips a year related to enhancing curriculum). This activity fee doesn't cover camp, or sports teams.

To make trip organisation easier for teachers, administration and parents, we ask for your generic consent for local trips. This consent for your child will remain in force as long as he/she is enrolled at this school. Please get in touch with the office to check if you are up to date with your forms.

STATIONERY

Your child's school stationery list requirements are uploaded online at myschool.co.nz/richmondroad. Simply select your child's Year Group lists and follow the instructions on the website. You can also pick up a paper copy of the stationery list from the office.

WATER ONLY SCHOOL

We are a 'water only' school. School staff will be reminding children of this and will also remove drinks other than water from children. They will be asked to take it home and not to bring it back.

LUNCH ORDERS

You can order at the lunch table (by the main office) or through web/mobile. You can ask the office if you have any questions.

Subway Ponsonby: You can order every day at school by dropping your Subway envelope in the Order box before 9am on the day. Please just make sure that the envelope has: the child's name, the unit and teacher, the money (Subway gives back the change if need be) and the detail of the order.

Pane and Vino: Lunches (pizza/pasta) from Pane & Vino can be ordered everyday from EZ lunch. Order by text or online from the online shop https://shop.tgcl.co.nz/. See their website http://www.ezlunch.co.nz for more information.

You can also order Pane and Vino and Subway with YQ. This service is available every day before 9.30am on the day. You can access the website here www.yq.co.nz or download the mobile app.

Grato Café: The Italian café across the road is providing healthy lunches to our school. You can order **before 9am on the day** by filling an order with cash at our lunch table or popping in her café to pay by Eftpos.
