Ruma 12 and 11 are now on **Seesaw**, thank you to all parents who have already activated their account. Students are working on making posting about their learning part of their everyday routines so you can be in touch with what is happening in the classroom.

The **Daily 5** is a framework for structuring literacy time so students develop lifelong habits of reading, writing, and working independently. Ruma 12 is putting it in place this week and they are off to a great start.

How does it work?

Students select from five authentic reading and writing choices, working independently toward personalized goals, while the teacher meets individual needs through whole-group and small-group instruction, as well as one-on-one conferring. These choices include

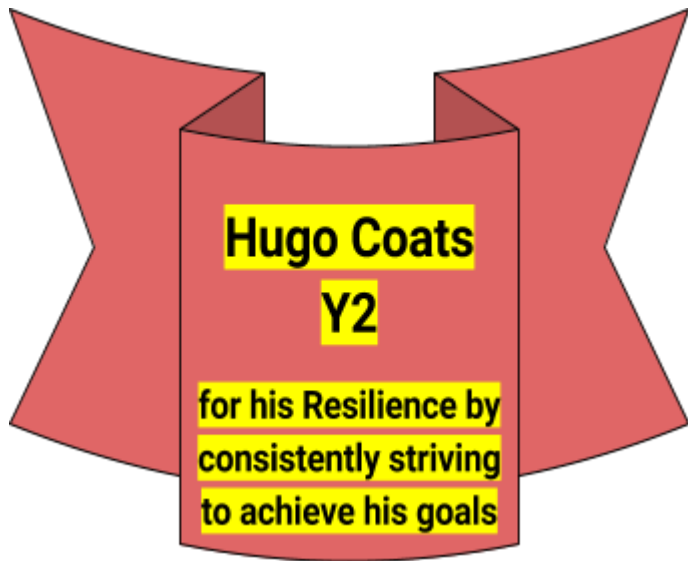
- Read to Self,

- Word Work.
